



EDUARDO G. BOBIER
DEPUTY GOVERNOR, BANGKO SENTRAL NG PILIPINAS

Mr. Eduardo G. Bobier started his journey in the Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (BSP) 34 years ago as Statistician at the Balance of Payments (BOP) group of the Department of Economic Research (DER) until his appointment as Assistant Governor, Comptrollership Subsector (COSs) in 2021.

Prior to his promotion as Assistant Governor (AG), Mr. Bobier was the head of Reserve Management Group (RMG), Chief Reserve Management Officer (CRMO) and Chief Investment Analytics Officer (CIAO) of the then Treasury Department (TD) now Financial Markets (FM) of the BSP. He was responsible for investing the Bank's reserves in liquidity and gold, foreign exchange, fixed income investments as well as derivatives transactions. He was also responsible for hiring and monitoring the performance of the Bank's external fund managers. He was given an outstanding rating as Chief Reserve Management Officer, reflecting his significant contributions in the development, implementation and execution of sound strategies and best practices in managing the BSP's international reserves. He also served as a member of the Investment Management Committee (IMC) chaired by the Governor. IMC approves strategies and provides advisory services related to the management of the BSP's international reserves. He also served as member of the Board of Trustees (BOT) of the BSP Provident Fund for two terms. He chaired the Housing Committee and the Investment Committee of the BSP Provident Fund.

As Assistant Governor and Comptroller, he was tasked with the maintenance of the accounting records of the Bank, including the submission and preparation of financial statements and budget. He is responsible for the daily operations of the sub-sector. He is the Chairman of the BSP Budget Committee.

Assistant Governor Bobier is a Certified Public Accountant. He holds a Master's Degree in Business Administration from the De La Salle University (Manila) and a Bachelor's Degree in Commerce major in Accounting from Manuel L. Quezon University where he graduated magna cum laude. He had his internship on portfolio management at the World Bank (WB) headquarters in Washington, DC, USA, in March to April 2011, and attended several workshops and meetings on accounting and budgeting, reserves management, operational and credit risk management under the WB's Reserves Advisory Management Program (RAMP).
