**R E S O L U T I O N N O. 2022-032A**

**WHEREAS**, the Facilities and General Services Department (FGSD) requested the Bids and Awards Committee (BAC) for the **Procurement of Security Services for PHILGUARANTEE Offices** with an **Approved Budget for the Contract of Pesos: Seven Million Three Hundred Eighty-Three Thousand Four Hundred Thirty-Two (PHP7,383,432.00)**, inclusive of all applicable taxes;

**WHEREAS**, **CFA 004-2022** in the amount of **Pesos: Seven Million Three Hundred Eighty-Three Thousand Four Hundred Thirty-Two (PHP7,383,432.00)** was issued by the Budget Management Department for this purpose;

**WHEREAS**, the requested procurement is under the approved Philippine Guarantee Corporation Annual Procurement Plan (APP) for FY 2022 – Supplemental 1, viz:

**WHEREAS**, the Invitation to Bid was posted on the PHILGUARANTEE and PhilGEPS websites and at PHILGUARANTEE-Jade office bulletin board on January 28, 2022;

**WHEREAS**, in response to the aforesaid invitation, the representatives from the following bidders attended the pre-bid conference on February 8, 2022:

1. Lifeguard Archangels Security Agency Corp.;
2. ARM Corporate Security Services, Inc.;
3. NBMD Security Agency;
4. Lockheed Federal Security Agency, Inc.; and
5. Arviter Top of the Line Security Investigation Specialist.

**WHEREAS**, the following suppliers submitted their quotations before the deadline of February 24, 2022; 1:15 P.M.:

1. ARM Corporate Security Services, Inc. received on February 24, 2022; 10:33 A.M.;
2. Lifeguard Archangels Security Agency Corporation received on February 24, 2022; 11:44 A.M.; and
3. Lockheed Federal Security Agency, Inc. received on February 24, 2022; 11:49 A.M.

**WHEREAS**, during the opening of bids on February 24, 2022; 1:30 P.M., the BAC on the basis of a non-discretionary “pass/fail” criterion as specified in the 2016 revised Implementing Rules and Regulations of Republic Act No. 9184 rated the bid of Lifeguard Archangels Security Agency Corporation as “failed” for their failure to submit the Price Schedule as specified in Section VIII. Checklist of Technical and Financial Documents and Bid Bulletin 1.

**WHEREAS**, Ms. Garcia of Lifeguard Archangels Security Agency Corporation agreed and accepted the decision of the BAC;

**WHEREAS**, on the same date, **ARM Corporate Security Services, Inc.** and **Lockheed Federal Security Agency, Inc.** were determined to have “PASSED” the Technical Components (Eligibility and Technical Requirements) and Financial Components;

**WHEREAS**, **ARM Corporate Security Services, Inc.** and **Lockheed Federal Security Agency, Inc.’s** Financial Bid were read as follows:

**WHEREAS**, on March 3, 2022, based on the bid evaluation and recommendation made by the TWG, the BAC declared the bids as calculated of **ARM Corporate Security Services, Inc.** and **Lockheed Federal Security Agency, Inc.** both in the amount of **PESOS: Seven Million One Hundred Sixty-Eight Thousand Five Hundred Ninety-Six 96/100 (Php7,168,596.96)**, inclusive of all applicable taxes as compliant to the requirements of PHILGUARANTEE;

**WHEREAS**, on March 15, 2022, upon verification, validation and ascertainment of the statements made and documents submitted by **ARM Corporate Security Services, Inc.** and **Lockheed Federal Security Agency, Inc.**, the TWG determined that both **ARM Corporate Security Services, Inc.** and **Lockheed Federal Security Agency, Inc.** have passed all the criteria of the post-qualification (legal, technical and financial) and determined and declared as the Lowest Calculated and Responsive Bidders and recommended to break the tie in accordance with the GPPB rulings;

**WHEREAS**, **Section 34.8** of the of the 2016 Revised Implementing Rules and Regulations of Republic Act No. 9184 provides that:

**“The post-qualification process shall be completed in not more than twelve (12) calendar days from the determination of the Lowest Calculated Bid/Highest Rated Bid. In exceptional cases, the post-qualification period may be extended by the HoPE, but in no case shall the aggregate period exceed forty-five (45) calendar days for Goods and Infrastructure Projects, or thirty (30) calendar days in Consulting Services.**

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to BAC Resolution No. 2022-030 the Head of the Procuring Entity approved the extension of post-qualification until March 16, 2022 for the tie-breaking to determine the winning bidder;

**WHEREAS**, Section 3 of Appendix 11 (Tie-Breaking Method) of the 2016 Revised Implementing Rules and Regulations of Republic Act No. 9184 provides that:

**3.1 In accordance with the considerations advanced/maintained in Policy Matter No. 02-2005, issued by the Government Procurement Policy Board, procuring entities are hereby given guidance on how to resolve cases involving a tie, after post-qualification, among bidders determined and declared as LCRB or HRRB.**

**3.2 Procuring entities are hereby required to identify at the onset of the bidding process, and thereafter include in the bidding documents as instruction or a matter of information to prospective bidders, a ready and clear measure to be used in the event two or more of the bidders have been post-qualified as LCRB or HRRB. In all cases, the measure determined by the procuring entity shall be non-discretionary and non-discriminatory such that the same is based on sheer luck or chance. The procuring entity may use “draw lots” or similar methods of chance.**

**3.3 However, in lieu of the pre-determined criteria set and declared in the bidding documents, the procuring entity may opt to bring the concerned bidders to agree on a better selection criteria which should also be non-discretionary/non-discriminatory and is similarly based on sheer luck or chance.**

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to the Bid Data Sheet of the Bidding Documents, the tie-breaking method shall be as follows:

**“In the event two or more of the bidders have been post-qualified as Lowest Calculated and Responsive Bid (LCRB), the BAC Chairperson shall roll a dice to break the tie in the presence of the bidder’s representative and COA representative (observer). The bidder with the highest number shall be declared as the winning bidder. The absence of the bidder’s representative or observer shall not nullify the proceeding.”**

**WHEREAS**, on March 16, 2022, both **ARM Corporate Security Services, Inc.** and **Lockheed Federal Security Agency, Inc.** agreed that they will roll the dice themselves simultaneously and the bidder’s dice with the highest total number shall be declared as the winning bidder;

**WHEREAS**, following the outcome of the tie-breaking method, **Lockheed Federal Security Agency Inc.** scored **eight (8)** points, while **ARM Corporate Security Services, Inc.** scored **six (6)** points;

**WHEREAS**, **ARM Corporate Security Services, Inc.** accepted that **Lockheed Federal Security Agency Inc.** is the winner of the tie-breaking process;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, in consideration of the foregoing circumstances, the Bids and Awards Committee (BAC), hereby **RESOLVE** the following:

- a) To declare **Lockheed Federal Security Agency Inc.** as the winning bidder for the **Procurement of Security Services for PHILGUARANTEE Offices** in the amount of **PESOS: Seven Million One Hundred Sixty-Eight Thousand Five Hundred Ninety-Six and 96/100 (Php7,168,596.96)** inclusive of all applicable taxes; and
- b) To recommend approval by the **Head of the Procuring Entity (HoPE)** the award of contract to **Lockheed Federal Security Agency Inc.** in the amount of **PESOS: Seven Million One Hundred Sixty-Eight Thousand Five Hundred Ninety-Six and 96/100 (Php7,168,596.96)** inclusive of all applicable taxes.


